ORDERS

The ICFAI University, Baddi admitted exceeds the approved intake in B.Com (99 admissions made against 90 sanctioned seats) and B.Sc. Non-Medical (20 admissions made against 18 sanctioned seats). In the matter a case has been registered in this Commission on 31.10.2019 and through notice dated 01.11.2019 Registrar of University was directed to appear on 05.11.2019. On 05.11.2019 University is directed to justify its plea that University has admitted students as per Govt. of India Ministry of Human Resource Development Department of High Education letter No.12-4/2019-U1 dated 17th January 2019. Respondent University has submit its reply vide letter No. IUHP/2019/HPPERC/814 dated 20.11.2019 stating that the issue regarding marginal increase in number of admissions in B.Com (9 students) and B.Sc. Non-Med (2 students) for the academic year 2019-20 was justified by the respondent University on the traditionally accepted norm of 10% allowance at the University level and accommodating students of Economically Weaker Section. University also submitted that the 10% allowance of enhancing the number has been general trend. Even in the academic year 2018-19, the University had accommodated 6 students in B.Com over the sanctioned intake of 60 seats and the same was justified to HP-PERC and was accepted by the Commission. Also in many Universities especially the Central

Universities a provision to the extent of 10% of the total seats in each course on supernumerary basis is permitted. The UGC permits 20% over enrollment in the Universities funded by it vide Para 3.10 of Chapter 3 In period flexibility and guiding principles for institutional housekeeping” which sets that “Over-enrolment is allowed on the understanding that no extra resources will be provided by the UGC. Over-enrollment across the whole institution not exceeding 4% for local students is permitted. As regards non-local students, in accordance with Government’s policy, institutions may enroll up to a level not exceeding 20% of the approved UGC funded student number by level. This 20% should all be outside the UGC-funded number across the whole institution is permitted. Institutions are free to exercise internal management here any over-enrollment occurs, within the overall ceiling of 120%”

Keeping in view the above facts hereby one time relaxation is given to the respondent University. University is also directed to strictly adhere the directions of the Commission in future.
