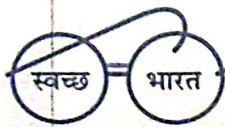

1	03.09.2024	<p>The matter was called up for hearing today. Mr Jasbir Singh appeared on behalf of Complainant and Registrar of the University appeared on behalf of respondent and the complainant filed rejoinder in the matter.</p> <p>In this matter the complaint was filed by the complainant and alleged that the respondent university have not issued his original post graduation MD Degree in radio diagnosis from 2019-22, despite giving full course fee of amount one crore twenty five lakhs rupees and after clearing all dues. In response to the complaint the respondent filed reply and submitted that the complainant took loan on Rs. 12 Lakhs from the respondent university for the treatment of cancer of his mother and therefore his degree is retained till the amount of Rs. 12 lakhs is paid by the complainant.</p> <p>On perusal of complaint, reply and rejoinder and other documents submitted by the parties, it has been transpired that real issue between the parties are of rupees 12 lakhs which is alleged to be taken as personal loan from the respondent. However, the Commission is concerned about the retaining about the degree by the respondent for the said amount. The Commission hereby observes that the respondent cannot exercise the</p>

right of lien ^{of} degree of student against the loan amount which is legally not permissible to any University.

The Commission hereby directs the petitioner to apply the no dues form in the respondent university and the university is directed to release the original MD degree of the complainant, if all dues are cleared. The loan amount cannot be considered as amount due in respect of university and is separate issue which needs to ^{be} separately dealt under any other provision of law.

Hence nothing survived in the matter and the same is disposed off.
